RE: YARD SAFETY

Riding scooters and bicycles through the school yard poses a threat to student safety and makes it extremely difficult for yard duty teachers to do their job of keeping all student/caregivers safe.

Safe Scooter Expectations

1. Student are required to **walk their scooter straight to the scooter shed** as soon as they arrive at school.
2. If a student is late and the scooter shed is locked they are to **walk their scooter straight to the office** where a staff member will assist them to put their scooter in the shed.
3. Scooters are **not** to be kept in classrooms or wet areas.

Each teacher in the school has spoken to their students about not riding their scooter through the school yard for safety reasons.

Consequences

Students who choose to continue to ride their scooters through the school or refuse to put them in the shed will be **banned** from having their scooters on site for a 5-day period.

A member of the Leadership team will call home to caregivers to advise them of the safety concerns and the consequence.

Family Recipes

Herb Cheese and Onion Puffs (Makes 12)

1 cups self-raising flour

½ an onion finely diced

1 egg

¼ cup milk

1 cup grated tasty cheese

¼ cup chopped herbs

Pre heat oven to 180 degrees, line 2 baking trays with baking paper.

Place flour, cheese, herbs and chopped onion in bowl.

In a jug mix eggs and milk whisk with a fork.

Add milk mixture to flour mixture, mix till just combined.

*do not over mix.

Place desert spoon on mixture onto trays 5 cm apart.

Bake for 15-20 minutes or until golden.

Room 8 News

This term Room 8 have been using their Layered Curriculum learning pedagogy to study the text 'The Hunger Games'. Layered Curriculum encompasses 48 tasks across eight different learning styles, meaning all students have tasks that appeal to their strengths, and some tasks that challenge them to improve their perceived weaknesses. Students have the option of what tasks and learning styles to explore through picking a group of 'free choice' tasks that appeal to them, as well as completing the compulsory tasks in classtime from across all the learning styles. Tasks within Layered Curriculum encompass a number of learning areas including Maths, English, the Arts, Geography and Civics & Citizenship (the old 'Social Studies').

Pictured below is Task 15, a visual/spatial tasks (for the artists). Students were asked to re-brand Panem (the country in the book) and all of the districts that make up the nation, all the while keeping the distinctive industry of each district visible.
