

Consequences for student behaviour

APPROPRIATE BEHAVIOUR: all teachers promote positive behaviour with clear class rules and strategies

1. Verbal encouragement
2. Pin charts
3. Stickers, certificates, office good work book, assembly awards

INAPPROPRIATE BEHAVIOUR: all teachers consistently follow these steps

Step	Action	Consequence
1.	Reminder	Label the behaviour and name the step/action
2.	Warning	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use logical consequences • Move, face away, write name up, Only ONE warning should normally be given
3.*	Classroom time out	Label the behaviour and name the step/action <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 15 minutes in classroom space (or other supervised area) • Use a timer and set work
4.*	Buddy class	Label the behaviour and name the step/action <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 20 minutes in another classroom (or other supervised area) • Use a timer and set work
5.*	Office time out	Label the behaviour and name the step/action <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 40 minutes in the office • Use a timer and set work • With green Behaviour record slip • Student completes SBM proforma, posted home
6.*	Take Home	Consequence depends upon severity and frequency of behaviours <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Second time out in the week ○ Serious behaviours <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Threatening, bullying ○ Constant refusal ○ Disrespect (swearing) ○ Violence, physical damage
7.	Suspension <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Internal (1 day) • External (up to 5 days) Exclusion <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Up to 10 weeks 	

A member of leadership is always made available to provide support at ANY step

- Talk to the student
- Escort the student to the next step
- Provide advice to the teacher

One warning is appropriate BETWEEN each step if necessary

Individual students may have negotiated behaviour plans

- 'mini steps' using Velcro tokens
- Every step is in the office (unrecorded)

SERIOUS MISBEHAVIOUR SHOULD RESULT IN AN OFFICE TIME OUT AND HOME FOLLOW UP IMMEDIATELY.

Students DO NOT always work through each step in logical order
