We stood up and showed our commitment with a Long Walk around the oval replicating Michael Long's Long Walk in 2004 where he walked 650km from his home in Melbourne to Canberra to speak with the Prime Minister about improving outcomes for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders. Along the way, many people joined to show their support for him and for the cause. We, as a whole school, walked around our oval to show our ongoing support for Reconciliation and our commitment to Being an Voice for Generations.

Our Community Hub has opened and started running playgroup and English Classes. We are thrilled with the success so far of the Hub and cant wait for more families to come and connect with the Hub- everyone is welcome!

Variety Children's Charity

Room 7 were recently the grateful recipients of a \$3550 grant from the Variety Children's Charity. The grant was spent on sensory equipment for Rm 7 regulation room. This room has been divided into spaces where students can access different items depending on what "zone of regulation" they are in.

Other items purchased were communication and social skills games, and gross and fine motor skill teaching aids. Equipment was carefully selected for each individual learning style outlined on students one-plans and with the communication between students' personal Occupational Therapists.

All students now have individual weighted lap blankets and noise cancelling headphones, enabling them to access the equipment they require to attend school assemblies and when in the community, on excursions.

2023 Woolworths Junior Landcare Grants Program





We're thrilled to announce that we have received a 2023 Woolworths Junior Landcare Grant for our project, First Nations Bush Tucker Garden.

The aim of our project is to create a First Nations bush tucker garden with native plants and flowers and include more native ingredients in our kitchen and garden program. Students will be involved in preparing the area before planting, maintaining the garden and incorporating plants in recipes made in our kitchen. The expected environmental and educational outcomes of the project include students learning about Indigenous plants and how they were traditionally used.

Elizabeth Park Primary School is one of 1,107 primary schools and early learning centres across Australia to receive a Woolworths Junior Landcare grant to help grow our next generation of environmental champions.

The children and teachers are looking forward to getting their hands dirty and learning from this project - we'll keep you updated!
