Rationale

At Elizabeth Park Preschool we promote and educate for sustainability. Educators aim to share with children the environmental impacts of humans and the interdependencies between people, animals, plants, lands and that water is central to education of sustainability. We continue to seek ways to improve our sustainability practices.

National Quality Standards

Educators will support children to:

- Recognise their interest in their world, their ability to engage with concepts and practices of sustainability and their capacity to advocate and act for positive change.
- Learn about where waste goes
- Use the Department for Education Waste Management System
- Sort waste into landfill, recycling, soft plastic and compost
- Grow vegetables, herbs and flowers with children in raised garden beds
- Engage in garden to plate experiences (Cooking) in the curriculum
- Be mindful of water consumption
- Use rainwater collected in a rainwater tank for play in the mud patch, etc.
- Engage in learning around lifecycles
- Use scrap paper for play, i.e. offices, writing, etc.

Educators will:

- Seek to improve practice on sustainability through trainings, staff meetings, educational readings and
- Use scrap paper for notes and messages.
- Liaise with external programs, businesses and services that can educate and strengthen sustainability practices at Elizabeth Park Preschool.

- Use a compost bin for food scraps
- Use natural play adjuncts
- Create natural play experiences logs, digging patch, mud kitchen, sand pit, log seating
- Prioritise the purchase and use of sustainable/recycled resources and products
- Use recycled materials for play such as cable reels, pots & pans
- Provide visuals in the children's bathroom flush buttons & hand towel paper usage
- Reduce laminating
- Switch off lights in rooms when not in use
- Use the rain water tank for sandpit play.
- Have removeable taps in the outdoor play space.
