News from the Principal

How are we almost finished term 1!? What an amazing start to 2024. We have welcomed new families and new staff and the focus on learning has shown us the great things our students are capable of.

Earlier this term we had an External Site Review where a panel of educators from DfE came and met with students, teachers and families to discuss the strengths of the school and look for opportunities to build on these strengths. The findings of the review was extremely positive ands were as follows:

The school has a collaborative culture, teachers are encouraged to work together to share practice and ideas.

Teachers collectively analyze student performance evidence in teaching groups to track and monitor student progress.

Teachers demonstrated a commitment to continuous improvement and shared responsibility towards improving student outcomes.

The Positive Behaviour for Learning approach fosters supports positive student behaviour across the school. Staff model and unpack the school values, while students learn positive school behaviors and routines, fostering high expectations for behaviour and student engagement in learning.

Families report that the school culture is welcoming, caring and supportive. They discussed a strong sense of community, connection, and respect between staff and families.
